# Lord Shiva

#### Brahma Samhita 5.45

kṣīraṁ yathā dadhi vikāra-viśeṣa-yogāt sañjāyate na hi tataḥ pṛthag asti hetoḥ yaḥ śambhutām api tathā samupaiti kāryād govindam ādi-puruṣaṁ tam ahaṁ bhajāmi

Just as milk is transformed into curd by the action of acids, but yet the effect curd is neither same as, nor different from, its cause, viz., milk, so I adore the primeval Lord Govinda of whom the state of **Śambhu** is a transformation for the performance of the work of destruction.

### Who is Lord Shiva?

- Lord Krishna is identified by Guru, Sadhu and Sastra as the Supreme Personality of Godhead and the source of all material and spiritual worlds (Bg. 10.8)
- When Lord Krishna wants to be in touch with this material world, He transforms into Lord Shiva. The Lord's glance wakes up material nature.
- So Lord Shiva is same as Lord Krishna, but also different
- Like milk and yogurt- Though milk and yogurt are essentially nondifferent, yogurt is a product of milk. One can use milk to make ghee, cheese, ice cream, or yogurt, but one cannot turn yogurt into milk.
- So, theologically, Shiva is both God and yet different from God as well.
- Because of Shiva's intimate contact with the material world and especially the quality of ignorance, the souls in this world may not receive the same spiritual restoration by worshiping him as by worshiping Vishnu.
- However Lord Shiva holds the keys to leave this material world and Lord Krishna holds the keys for the souls to enter the spiritual world.
- Lord Shiva's devotees are of 3 types
  - Ghosts, hobbling's, demons etc



  - Yogis, tapasvis





- So Lord Shiva is same as Lord Krishna, but also different
- Like milk and yogurt- Though milk and yogurt are essentially nondifferent, yogurt is a product of milk. One can use milk to make ghee, cheese, ice cream, or yogurt, but one cannot turn yogurt into milk.
- So, theologically, Shiva is both God and yet different from God as well.
- Because of Shiva's intimate contact with the material world, the souls in this world may not receive the same spiritual restoration by worshiping him as by worshiping Vishnu. However, he is greatest devotee of Lord Krishna [vaisnavanam yatha sambhu] and always in meditation.
- Lord Shiva holds the keys to leave this material world. However, Lord Krishna holds the keys for the souls to enter the spiritual world.
- Lord Shiva's devotees are of 3 types
  - Ghosts, hobbling's etc
  - Yogis
  - Those who want material possessions

## Position of Shiva in the Trinity

- Lord Shiva is superior to Lord Brahma, who is an empowered soul (ordinary jiva), but Shiva is not quite on the same level as Vishnu.
- Number of qualities possessed:
  - 50 Brahma (jiva). If we develop these 50 qualities we can become Brahma
  - 55 Shiva
  - 60 Vishnu
  - 64 Krishna
- It is therefore said that Lord Shiva is a unique living being who merits His own category, known as Shiva-tattva.
- Shiva has His abode in Mt Kailash and beyond this world his abode is known as Shivaloka (between the material world & Vaikuntha)
- Lord Shiva is one of the Guna Avatars in charge of the mode of ignorance and destroys the universe at the appropriate time
- Lord Sambhu [Shiva] is regarded as the greatest among devotees of Lord Vishnu [vaisnavanam yatha sambhu]." (Srimad-Bhagavatam 12.13.16)

### Many names of Shiva

- Sadashiva (original form who resides between material and spiritual worlds)
- Sambhu (Auspicious)
- Shiva (means Auspicious)
- Nataraja (the king of dancers),
- Rudra (Enraged form of Shiva),
- Dhakshinamoorthy (Yoga form of Shiva)
- Viswanatha (lord of the universe)
- Mahadeva (Chief of the demigods)
- Shankara (giver of knowledge)
- Neelakanta (blue throat)
- Bholenath (simple)
- Ashutosh (easily pleased)





### The worship of Lord Shiva


- Lord Shiva is among the most widely worshiped deities in India.
- The most popular form of worshipping Lord Shiva is in the Lingam form. It is known as Shivalinga or Jyotirlinga.
- The Shiva Purana describes the origin of the lingam as the beginning-less and endless cosmic pillar (Stambha) of fire, the cause of all causes.
- The major 12 <u>Jyotirlinga</u> Shiva temples of India, such as in Varanasi and Somanatha, are particularly frequented on Maha Shivaratri.
- Varanasi (Benares) is considered to be the city specially loved by Shiva, and is one of the holiest places of pilgrimage in India.
- Often His worshippers pray to Lord Shiva to gain material wealth almost like a business transaction – not selfless devotion
- According to Vaisnava, the authorized method of worship of Shiva is described bythe Rudra Sampradaya (also known as the Vishnusvami Sampradaya), an authorised Vaisnava lineage started by Shiva Himself, in which Shiva is worshiped as the greatest devotee of Vishnu.
- Shiva is bathed with milk and bel patra leaves















### Qualities of Shiva

- Compassionate gives shelter to those who everyone has rejected
- Very kind
- Humility gatekeeper at many holy places
- Easily pleased (known as Ashutosh)
- Peaceful constantly meditating on the Lord
- Impartial –seeing good in others, ignoring the bad qualities
- Even Lord Rama worshiped Lord Shiva because Shiva is His very dear devotee
- Greatest devotee of Lord Krishna [vaisnavanam yatha sambhu]
- Special relationship with Lord Krishna. Shiva holds the key to get us out of the material world and Krishna holds the key to get us into the spiritual world




## Lord Shiva as Sripada Shankaracarya

- \*There are twelve great authorities in preaching God consciousness and Lord Shiva is one of them
- \*His disciplic succession is also known as the Vishnu Svami-sampradaya, and is also known as the Vallabha-sampradaya.
- \*The current Brahma-sampradaya is known as the Madhva-Gaudiya-sampradaya, which is what ISKCON belongS to.
- \*Lord Shiva appeared as Shankaracarya in 686AD to preach Mayavada philosophy (in order to counteract Buddhism)
- \*However, at the end of his pastime in the form of Shankaracarya, he preached the Vaishnava philosophy: bhaja govindam bhaja govindam mudha-mate.














- Lord Shiva appears in this world due to the anger of Lord Brahma
- Shiva is married to Parvati and has 2 sons called Ganesh & Kartikeya
- Ganga received on Lord Shiva's head when she flowed from the spiritual world
- Lord Rama worshipped Shivalinga before crossing into Lanka
- In Krishna lila
  - Lord Shiva came to have darshan of baby Krishna




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
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
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- Bhagavatam discusses the pastime with Daksha, Pracetas



## Shiva glorifies the name of Rama

#### Shiva explains to Parvati:

- At Kashi when someone dies they are liberated. So many people go there to die. Lord Shiva explains that because he always chants the name of Rama and Vayu (wind) spread the name everywhere in Kashi, people are liberated.
- Ganesh is worshipped first before any auspicious activity because he won the race among the demigods by circumbulating Rama's name 3 times
- Never have fights as a family because always chanting the holy name of Rama:
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
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  - Carrier of Parvati is Lion Vs Lord Shiva's bull
  - Ganesh's carrier is a mouse but Lord Shiva has snake around his neck
  - Kartikeya has peacock as carrier who eats snake








# Difference between worshippers of Shiva & Vishnu

- Shaivites wear tilak across the forehead
- Vaishnavs wear tilak differently
- Shaivities believe the world is an illusion
- Vaisnavas believe that the world is real but temporary
- Shaivites study Shiva Puruna
- Vaisnavas study Bhagavad Gita & Bhagavat Purana
- Shaivites believe that God has no form and they can merge with God
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- Some Shaivities smoke bhanga & cover themselves in ashes
- Vaishnavs follow the 4 regulative principles



## How do Vaisnavas observe Shivaratri

- Guru, Sadhu and sastra advises that we honour Lord Shiva as the greatest devotee
- Nanda Maharaja and Brijbasis would sometimes go to a temple in Gujarat to observe Maha Shivarati
- Their mood was to
  - pray for the welfare of Krishna
  - Pray to be more attached to Krishna
- Similarly Gopis would approach Katyani Devi and Lord Shiva to have Krishna as their husband
- Srila Prabhupada approved the worship of Shiva in the right mood (not as God, but His devotee) Advaita Acharya is incarnation of Shiva and as member of the Pancha-Tattva we worship daily.
- Fasting on Maha-Shivatri is optional some do ekadasi fast
